75th Anniversary News

In the aftermath of World War II, when Japanese women lacked suffrage and societal roles, a group of female volunteers emerged in Tokyo—now CWAJ. With permission from General Headquarters, the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers during post war occupation, we established a travel fund to support Japanese students struggling to afford dollar-based travel expenses to the United States of America. Guided by the motto "boldly taking on challenges that society needs but for which there are no precedents," CWAJ has grown over 75 years, expanding its scholarships program to nearly 900 students from 40 countries. These scholarships have been made possible through generous donations from members and donors, as well as proceeds from the CWAJ Print Show, an annual event since 1956. The Print Show has also played a significant role in promoting and popularizing contemporary Japanese printmaking, both domestically and internationally.

In 2024, CWAJ proudly celebrated its 75th anniversary. We remain committed to fostering international and cultural exchange through education, art, community, and friendship. We have gradually shifted to a digital world with technological innovation to catch up with current trends. As our memories of the past fade, we remain committed to nurturing the seeds our predecessors planted 75 years ago, and passing them on to the next generation. Promoting Women's Empowerment at CWAJ's "International Women's Day" Event

CWAJ held an event on March & 2024, at the Foreign Correspondents' Club of Japan to commemorate International Women's Day and raise awareness of the organization. The event, featured four successful women who shared their experiences navigating male-dominated fields and discussed ways to empower women and promote gender equality in Japan.



Mieko Nakabayashi, Waseda University professor and well-known political commentator, gave the keynote speech. She was later joined in a panel discussion with Yoko Narahashi, producer, award-winning director, and casting director; Kanoko Oishi, CEO and founder of Mediva, a healthcare consulting and service operation company; and Arfiya Eri, a member of Japan's House of Representatives. Emiko Magoshi, honorary professor at J.F. Oberlin University and a radio personality, served as moderator.

A strong message emerged from their speeches and the panel discussion: if you believe in what you are passionate about, you will succeed. This message appeared to inspire and encourage many members of the audience. Some of them expressed heartfelt gratitude towards the speakers for sharing their personal experiences and offering insights and advice on how to persevere and succeed in a society that retains many anachronistic customs and biases against women.

With three media representatives in attendance and an audience of more than 70 women and men, we succeeded in spreading the word about CWAJ and its work in promoting the empowerment of women in Japan.

Celebrating Art, Legacy, and Community at the 67th CWAJ Print Show

Art enthusiasts from Japan and beyond gathered for the 67th CWAJ Print Show, held from October 16 - 20 at the Hillside Forum in Daikanyama, Tokyo. Featuring 207 remarkable prints by established and emerging artists, the juried exhibition offered a delightful mix of styles, from traditional to pop, and techniques, from woodblock to digital. It is a testament to CWAJ's commitment to artistic excellence and its role in the development of young artists.

The Print Show continues to support young talent through the annual Young Printmaker Award (YPA), now in its 20th year. This year's YPA winner, AOYAGI Yuka, presented a collection that captivated the audience. In addition, the CWAJ Print Show Loro Piana Woman Artist Award was presented for the third consecutive year, with emerging artist Park Aeri receiving the 500,000 yen prize. Park's exceptional work, which draws on her Japanese and Korean heritage, reflects great promise for the future of printmaking.

As always, the Print Show was about more than just art; it was a celebration of community.

October 17, members and overseas visitors gathered at Bistro Favori for a warm evening of conversation and connection. During the show,

visually impaired guests enjoyed our Hands-on Art program while past scholarship recipients came to show their support and enjoy the ever-popular guided tour as well as the embossing workshop led by artist Katsutoshi Yuasa.

This year's Print Show concluded with an online gallery sale from October 22 to 27, allowing collectors around the world to share in the excitement and to support CWAJ's mission. The online gallery remains accessible for viewing year-round at https://cwaj-gallery.jp/.

Net proceeds from the Print Show go to CWAJ's scholarship and education programs, bringing art, learning, and opportunity to future generations. Our heartfelt thanks to everyone who attended, participated, and supported this year's show, making it a memorable celebration of art, legacy, and community.

From 21 June to 26 October 2025, 136 prints, mainly from the 67th exhibition, will be exhibited and sold at Highfield Hall and Gardens, a

CWAJ 75th Anniversary Special Exhibition 'Trailblazers' at Tokyo American Club and Hillside Forum

Aspecial highlight of this year's event was the special exhibition "Trailblazers" in celebration of CWAJ's 75th anniversary. Held at both the Hillside Forum and the Frederick Harris Gallery at the Tokyo American Club (TAC) "Trailblazers" paid tribute to five pioneering women artists who profoundly shaped Japanese art in the 20th century: SHINODA Toko, YOSHIDA Chizuko, IWAMI Reika, YANAGISAWA Noriko, and TATSUNO Toeko. Featuring over 50 works, this exhibition honored the enduring legacy of these artists and showed the paths they have paved for future generations.

Keynote speaker Professor Yukiko Fukagawa from Waseda University (Study Abroad Scholar, 1994) spoke about "Changing Japan-U.S. Economic Partnership in East Asia." The hybrid format meant that SA scholar Ms. Aya Tsutsui, who was already studying abroad, could join us on Zoom.

Also in attendance were 2021 Nursing Scholars Ms. Meika Hayakawa and Ms. Takara Oyama. The 2021 presentation was online due to COVID-19, so CWAJ members were delighted to be able to meet them in person.

Ms. June Miyachi, Cartier Japan President & CEO, announced that Cartier Japan would continue to fully fund a CWAJ Cartier Scholarship in 2025. In addition, Cartier Japan will open the 'Women's Pavilion in collaboration with Cartier' at the Osaka/Kansai Expo 2025, and will call on visitors to aspire to a fair and sustainable future through the experiences and perspectives of women. Former CWAJ scholars will participate in a panel discussion in the 'WA' space in the pavilion.

COMMUNITY SERVICE

Volunteers for the Visually Impaired (VVI)

The Volunteers for the Visually Impaired (VVI) serve visually impaired students and adults by providing English language programs and holding special events. Over the years WI's programs have evolved, but our mission has stayed the same: supporting a variety of activities in English aimed at encouraging education, cross-cultural exchange, and friendship with the visually impaired community.

Information about VVI and CWAJ events is regularly sent to visually impaired friends through electronic and braille editions of our triannual newsletter. In 2024, VVI members conducted online mock test interviews for 19 high school students at the Special Needs Education School for the Visually Impaired, University of Tsukuba, who were preparing for the biannual Eiken Test in Practical English Proficiency. A one-to-one English conversation program, led by native English-speaking CWAJ overseas volunteers (English Conversation Partners), was also offered to students upon request. Throughout 2024, CWAJ volunteers taught English twice a week at the Japan Vocational Development Center for the Blind and Low Vision where adults are re-training for jobs for which English ability is a valuable qualification. The classes are fun, practical, and help students build confidence in speaking English.

In May, volunteers and visually impaired friends held the first in-person English Conversation Gathering after a gap of several years at Temple University. A volunteer introduced the culture of Sweden. Miku Kawakami played the nyckelharpa, a traditional Swedish instrument. Everyone enjoyed the music and Swedish food! In September, we had an online gathering to hear Josh Grisdale speak about his own disability and experiences. He is a strong advocate for improving accessibility for the disabled. Josh explained how he started Accessible Japan and Tabi Folk, websites aimed at providing information about traveling in Japan to people with disabilities.

To commemorate WI's 50th anniversary in 2025, we are planning to host special events and to publish a booklet about our 50-year history.

English Outreach for Children (EOC)

In 2024 EOC visited St. Joseph's Home for Children five times.

For each visit we base the lesson around a picture book, which one of our members has translated into Japanese. On the back of each book, we have provided a QR link to a bilingual recording of our members reading the book in English and Japanese, so that it can be enjoyed any time.

We have helped them to learn some English words and phrases. During each lesson we divide them into small groups so that our members can provide individual attention to each child and allow them to practice. Rotating through four stations (book reading, games, crafts, and worksheets) allows the children to have fun and be exposed to English in a variety of fun settings.

Foreign Students Circle (FSC)

Foreign Students Circle (FSC) events provide foreign students with valuable opportunities to deepen their understanding of Japanese culture and customs. Each foreign student is paired with a CWAJ mentor, which further enhances their education about Japan. This personalized approach is one of FSC's unique features.
